

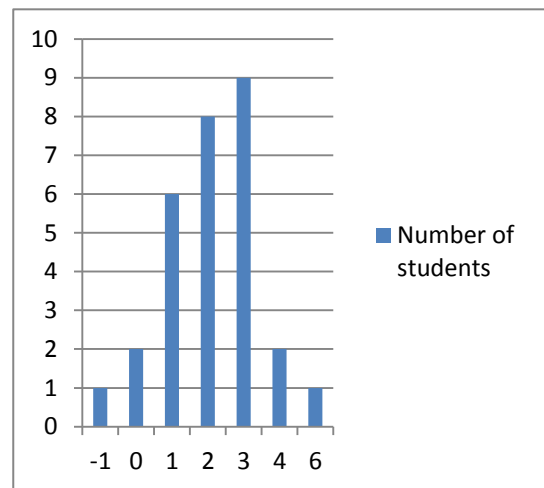
# Catch-up Premium Report-Ricards Lodge High School

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding (£500 per student) to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4C in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

All students at Ricards are taught English in sets from the beginning of year 7 and receive 6 hours a fortnight of lessons. All students in year 7 are taught mathematics in sets for 6 hours per fortnight. When CUP literacy or numeracy students achieve their level 4b or above, they can leave their CUP support group. Therefore, as the year progresses each support group becomes smaller allowing more intensive support to be provided for those who require more help.

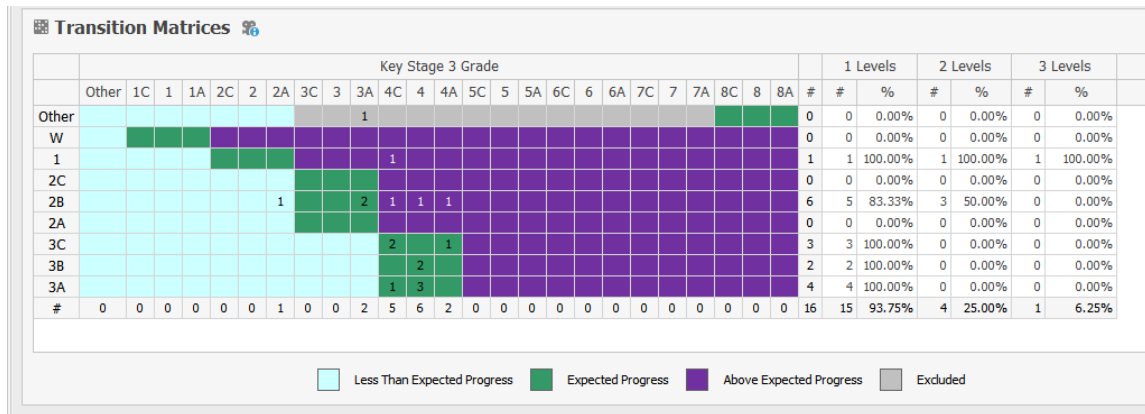
## 2015/16

**CUP Numeracy:** Out of the 30 students who received an additional 2 hours of small group numeracy tuition a week, 18 of them achieved a level 4C or above by the end of the academic year with one student achieving a level 5b. 7 students were working at a level 3A by the end of the academic year (with all students having made progress apart from 3). In terms of progress 20 of the 30 students made at least 2SLOP or more throughout the year and 6 students made 1SLOP. Students who did not achieve the minimum of a 4C will receive continued support during year 8. Students who were on both of the CUP numeracy and literacy programmes enjoyed 6 additional hours per fortnight, 3 of numeracy and 3 of literacy.

**CUP Literacy:** 17 students were on the CUP literacy programme and enjoyed an additional 2 hours of literacy per week throughout the academic year. All students with KS2 data made progress, with 11 students making 3 or more sub levels of progress. 8 students achieved a level 4B or 4A and 5 students achieved a level 4C. 3 students were working at a level 3A by the end of the year and so were very close to achieving their minimum target of a 4C (2 of them achieved 4SLOP which is very good, one student didn't have any KS2 data). Students who were on both of the CUP numeracy and literacy programme enjoyed 6 additional hours per fortnight, 3 of numeracy and 3 of literacy.



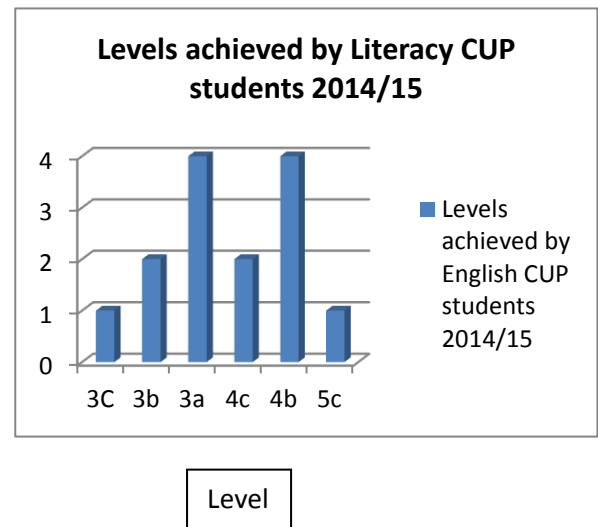
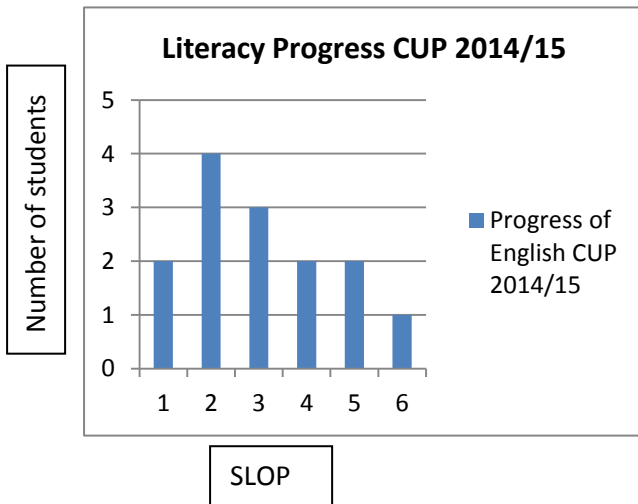
**Budget:** The government informed us at the beginning of the academic year 2015/16 that we would be receiving £18,000 to support these CUP students. The budget was allocated to support the cost of additional staffing to run the small group tuition that successfully took place. It was also used to purchase curriculum teaching and learning support materials from the Shine and Level Up numeracy scheme of work's. To support literacy, teaching and learning support materials were purchased from the 'On the Edge' reading scheme to enhance reading, comprehension and writing skills. We also purchased from the 'Everyone Can Learn' scheme of work to support the development of SPaG and comprehension.

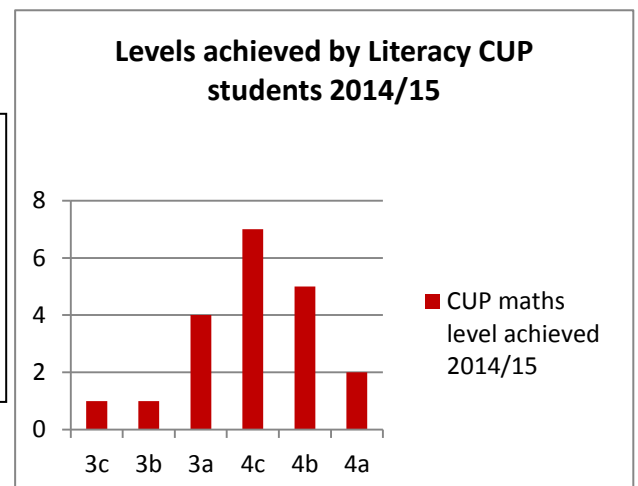
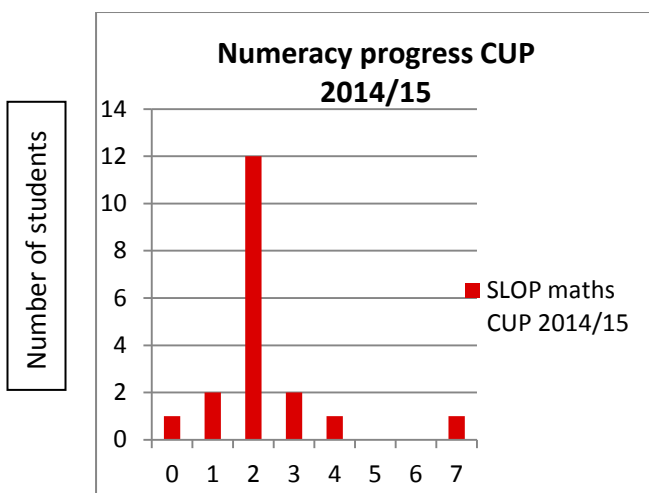
### 2014/2015

We had 11 numeracy CUP students, 6 literacy CUP students and 9 students who required both numeracy and literacy catch-up. We received a total of £15,500. Please find below the impact the support made in both literacy and numeracy.



The literacy CUP was used to purchase resources and to fund the staffing of small group lessons in literacy following the program.

At the start of 2014/15 the identified literacy students were given a 5 week course for two hours a week where they worked on boosting their understanding of, and application of, literacy skills at word and sentence level. Throughout the rest of the year the cohort of literacy CUP students received have the equivalent of one hour a week of these sessions with regular assessment to gauge progress.

SLOP

The numeracy funding was used to purchase CGP Key Stage 2 Level 4 workbooks for each student. These were used in with the level 3-to-4 booster modules on MyMaths. The 20 students who arrived with a level 4 or below in maths received one hour a fortnight, in three small groups of targeted teaching with a maths specialist teacher. Funding was used to pay for curriculum resources and staffing hours
